WHY SHOULD YOU VOTE?

Voting is one of the most powerful ways to make your voice heard in our democracy, but in 2020, only 66.8% of the voting-age population in the United States reported voting.

Modern technology has improved access to information on candidates and made it easier to register to vote in many areas, and it is vital to be aware of how you can participate in the 2024 election cycle.



ALASKA'S ABSENTEE AND MAIL-IN VOTING PROCEDURES

Permanent absentee/ mail-in voting procedures:

- No excuse required to request an absentee ballot
- Applications can be submitted via mail, in-person, email, fax, online



ALASKA'S EARLY VOTING DEADLINES

Early Voting **Begins:** **October 21**

Early Voting **Ends:** **November 5**

DEADLINES TO KNOW FOR VOTING IN ALASKA



VOTER REGISTRATION DEADLINE:

October 6

Thirty days before an election.



ABSENTEE / MAIL-IN VOTING BALLOT DEADLINES:

Request must be received by

October 26

Ten days before the election; 5 PM the day before the election for electronically delivered ballots.



BALLOT SUBMISSION DEADLINE:

Must be received within 10 days of the election if postmarked on or before Election Day.

Postmarked by Election Day
