WHY SHOULD YOU VOTE?

Voting is one of the most powerful ways to make your voice heard in our democracy, but in 2020, only 66.8% of the voting-age population in the United States reported voting.

Modern technology has improved access to information on candidates and made it easier to register to vote in many areas, and it is vital to be aware of how you can participate in the 2024 election cycle.

Permanent absentee/ mail-in voting procedures:

- No excuse required to request an absentee ballot
- · Applications can be submitted via mail, in-person

ABSENTEE / MAIL-IN VOTING BALLOT DEADLINES:

Request must be received by

October 21 by mail; November 4 in-person

Fifteen days before the election at 5 PM for mail-out ballots; the day before the election for in-person requests.




